For more than five decades, Beef Empire Days has been a mainstay in Southwest Kansas. Built around the Beef Empire Days live and carcass show, it was a vision of John Dohogne, in 1967. Mr. Dohogne, the Plant Manager at Garden City's Producers Packing Company, collaborated with Earl C. Brookover and together they began the first Beef Empire Days Live and Carcass Show in 1969.

So what is "the beef empire"? "Beef Empire" was prompted by a study conducted at Oklahoma State University in the late 1960's. The study labeled an area 100 miles on either side of a line drawn from Lubbock, TX to North Platte, NE, as the Beef Belt of the U.S. Realizing that Southwest Kansas (Garden City in particular) is located in the heart of that area, this was recognized as the groundwork for a salute to the Beef Empire.

The now 10-day celebration provides approximately 16 events geared to the cattle feeding industry, the arts and humanities, and the athletics of the High Plains area. Each of these events is made possible by dedicated volunteer chairs and sponsors, and the cooperation of Finney County and the City of Garden City.

Throughout the years, Beef Empire Days' original goals have remained. They include: advancement in the production and quality of beef; improvement of communications; and continued education and promotion of beef. These are the goals that guide the Board of Directors and the many volunteers who work diligently to organize the events that make up Beef Empire Days.



DR CLINT ALEXANDER CARCASS CONTEST JUDGE

Clint Alexander serves as a Professor of Animal and Food Science at Garden City Community College, where he also serves as the head coach of the meat judging team and the director of the GCCC Meat Lab, Buster Red Meats. He also leads one of the largest online food science/safety programs in the US meeting the needs of the USDA Food Safety Inspection Service. He is originally from Satanta, Kansas, where he was exposed to the meat evaluation and processing world at a young age. He was a member of the 1990 State Champion Meats Team as a freshman in high school. Clint attended Garden City Community College and was a member of the 1993-94 Meats Team while earning an Associate of Science in Animal Science. He transferred to Texas Tech University where he was a member of the 1996 National Champion Meats Team and was voted as the Doug Hardison Award winner as the most outstanding judging team member at Texas Tech that year. He never placed lower than 5th in any contest during his judging career at Texas Tech.

After graduating from TTU with a Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural Education, he started graduate school and was coach of the 1999 Meats Team at Texas Tech University that also won a National Championship. Upon completion of his Master of Science in Animal Science with an emphasis in Meat Science and Muscle Biology, he was hired at Garden City Community College in August of 2000. He has been the department leader and professor in Animal and Food Science for 23 years as well as the head meats coach. He was awarded the Most Outstanding Faculty Member at GCCC in 2006 as well as the NISOD teaching


award in 2018. In 2007, he was awarded a sabbatical from GCCC and enrolled at Texas Tech University to attain a doctoral degree. He was named an AT&T Chancellor's Fellow and a member of the Golden Key Honor Society during this phase of his education. He graduated in 2012 with a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Animal Science with an emphasis in Meat Science and Food Safety.

During his tenure at GCCC, his meat judging teams have won 7 National Championships (2003, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023) and 6 Reserve National Championships (2001, 2005, 2009, 2011, 2018 and 2019), the Australian Championship (2014) and he has coached 33 All-American's since the award was created in 2002. With the opening of the GCCC Meat Lab in 2013, he has helped incorporate more layers of hands-on teaching and judging methodology to the coursework and judging team experiences at GCCC. He has meat judging alumni that are in all aspects of the industry from food safety experts, grading officials, teachers, pharmaceutical industries and even has an alumni that has interned with NASA. Along with teaching and coaching duties, he serves as a faculty advisor for over 200 students from around the country. He is an active member of the American Meat Science Association, including the President of the Intercollegiate Meat Coaches Association Board in 2019 and is a current A-division director on the board. He has one of, if not the only, Animal Welfare and Handling courses being taught at a community college and is introducing more courses each semester to be taught online to the USDA program students.

Clint, along with his wife, Paula, and their daughter, Paxton, reside outside Garden City. Paxton is involved in the Finney County 4-H program where she is involved in many projects, including livestock species of swine, sheep and goats.







PAT KOONS MARY HOPKINS AWARD

Pat Koons, Burdick, Kansas, is the 2023 recipient of the Mary M. Hopkins Award. Pat and his family have been lifelong supporters of the Kansas livestock industry and the Beef Empire Days with Pat serving on the Board of Directors from 1978-1980.

The patriarch of the family, Pat Koons, was born near Council Grove, Kansas. He attended Kansas State University and majored in Animal Sciences and Industry. He actively participated in many clubs, the Little American Royal, judging teams, and worked as well as lived at the purebred beef barn.

Upon graduation in 1964, Pat served his country in the U.S. Army for two years. In 1966, he returned to Kansas and assumed the position of purebred herd manager at the Dewey Ranch south of Manhattan. He then managed the OK Ranch south of Junction City, Kansas. In 1971, Pat went to work for CattleFax as a market analyst and developing grass roots producer support for a fledging entity.

In 1972, Pat assumed the general manager position of Kearny County Feeders Inc. near Lakin, Kansas. During the next 34 years Pat developed natural, NHTC, source and age programs, Bred Heifer Program and Auction, and was responsible for pricing options, feed yard operations and

customer relations. In his spare time, he served on the KLA Board of Directors, Feeder Council chairman, and the Beef Empire Days board of directors as well as president. Along with serving on the National Livestock and Beef Board, as well as sharing his time with the Kansas Fairgrounds Foundation.

Pat is a member of the Livestock and Meat Industry Council Royal Board and past president. Pat was the lead in raising funds for the construction of the Stanley Stout Center and part of the team that oversaw building this remarkably highly utilized facility.

In 2008, Pat chose to return to his roots in the Flint Hills and became a self-employed rancher overseeing a cow-calf and stocker operation. He continues to share his experience and insight of the cattle industry as a cattle feeding consultant.

Pat's family has played a vital role in Pat's life. Pat and his wife, Sharon, have been married for 39 years. His siblings are involved in agriculture and have been industry leaders. Pat's five children and now grandchildren maintain his presence at livestock shows and competitions. His children include:

Pat knows very few strangers and his easy laugh and appreciation of others fills any room he enters.






KEITH DOWNER PARADE GRAND MARSHAL

Keith L Downer in 1933 Burrell and Alta May Downer traded a 1929 Chevy truck for a farm in Leach Oklahoma where Keith was born in 1935 .Grandpa "Dat" Downer came in 1936 and moved Beryl and his family back to the garden City area and Keith graduated from garden City high School in 1953 Keith grew up around horses and cattle he got his first cowboy job working at the garden City sale Barn for Pat Springer when he was 15 he worked all the odd jobs of the sale barn and corrals learning the cattle business every step of the way sorting doctor ring pin writing selling and loading. This would be the foundation for his future Earl Brookover and Jerry Chmelka bought the sale barn in 1957

this would be the beginning of a lifetime bond between these men Keith became order buyer for cattle at the garden City sale Barn in 1964 he met every cattleman and knew every sale barn for a 200 mi radius in 1963 a horse fell on Keith's left leg and shattered his ankle and leg bones his bones were reset but he lay in traction and casts for 15 months this gave Keith a permanent "hitch in his giddyup" Keith's next job was head cowboy for Brookover feed yards where he started in 1965 and worked in that capacity for 25 years.



Along the way he also found time

to train and ride a huge steer named Big George Keith and Big George appeared in parades grand openings fares and rodeos around the Midwest promoting beef and Brooke over feed yards his favorite horse was Katie who he rode for many years and kept after his retirement in 1990 he

continued to work as a cattle buyer owner and feeder he then worked for Elanco chemical as a liver checker for several years in beef packing plants in Holcomb, Dodge City and Liberal. Recording the condition of thousands of livers along the way, Keith took to poetry after his retirement and began to perform with a group of four old Western Kansas cowboys called the partners of the prairie they performed at shows and banquets schools and exposed across the Midwest while singing old western songs and reading their poetry to dazzle the crowds from near and far in 2000 they were invited to perform for the US troops in Illesheim, Germany where they met the troops and had a grand experience.

Keith published his own book of poetry in 2017 titled cowboy memories. He serves on the board of directors for the Finney County Historical Society assisting with the many projects demonstrations and fundraisers they have he recently was instrumental in getting access to and completing the purchase of the original guns of Fleagle Gang of Finney county these guns were used in the robbery and killing spree that occurred in Colorado and Kansas in 1928 Keith is a member of the Community Congregational Church and choir He's happily married to Candy his lovely wife of 37 years he will leave behind five generations of descendants Keith is small and stature but large in compassion honesty and character he has a sharp wit with an ever engaging personality and he has a million friends this was biography used in 2020 as the working cowboy Kansas Hall of Fame inductee.





MITCH HOLTHUS BANQUET KEYNOTE

Mitch Holthus is the voice of the Kansas city chiefs and is the longest tenured and most decorated play-by-play "voice" in franchise history. He was on the call of super bowls 54 & 57 when the chiefs won their second and third super bowl championships. He also was on the call of super bowl 55 in February, 2021.

Holthus is also the host of the Hy-vee chiefs insider television show and the chiefs rewind post game show featured on several digital platforms. In addition, he originates the "Minute with Mitch" radio and television series which is seen and heard in five states. His work is also featured on chiefs.com.

Holthus is a member of the Kansas association of broadcasters hall of fame, the Kansas state university athletics hall of fame and in June 2022 was inducted into the Missouri broadcasters association hall of fame. As a result, he will be only one of three individuals in both the KAB and MBA halls of fame joining his former broadcast partner Len Dawson and the late Fred White.

Holthus has won five Emmys for his video and on-line work by the academy of television arts and sciences.

in addition, Holthus is a past recipient of the Kansas city sports journalist of the year. in 2018, he was listed with the voice of the Royals Denny Matthews as one of the top 13 "one-two" play by play pairs in America by the sports broadcast journal. He was also named the 2020 Missouri



sportscaster of the year and has been the Kansas sportscaster of the year eight times.

he has served on the board of directors of the national sports media association and is a past president of the organization. Holthus has two degrees from Kansas state university, one in journalism and another in business administration.

he and his wife Tami who is originally from McPherson, KS have a son and daughter and two granddaughters.

Holthus is a native of Smith Center, Kansas.
